Al Johnson, *RISC, USA*

Mr. Johnson is the Operations Manager and Senior Trainer with RISC. He has served as a military EOD technician, EOD Company Commander, and task force commander in Iraq, Saudi Arabia, and Kuwait, Counter IED advisor in Thailand and Laos, and as an analyst with the Federal Government. He has been awarded the State Departments Franklin Award for his Counter IED education and training programs in SE Asia.

Morgan Wilson, *USA (Home Made Explosive Recognition and Safety)*

Mr. Wilson is an Army EOD technician. He has served in Iraq and Thailand supporting and leading counter IED operations. Mr. Wilson is a graduate of the Dougway Proving Ground's Energetic Materials Course, the ATF Post Blast Course, and Advanced IED course with the US Military.

Stephan Cathers, *RISC, USA*

Mr. Cathers is currently Manager of Training for RISC Management. He has served as Senior Team Leader in an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Company and he conducted the identification, rendering safe, and disposal of conventional, chemical, and improvised explosive devices. During his 11 years in the Army and three deployments to Afghanistan, he has trained over 400 law enforcement and over 3,500 military in unexploded ordnance and improvised explosive devices, recognition, safety and awareness.
